WALKING PATH

The walking path in Historic Webster Village will become a reality this year! It was the most requested item listed on surveys completed by township residents in 2022. We have all but \$25,000 of the \$94,550 it will cost to completely install this path, the major goal for the first year of our Implementation Grant: Creating Community Connections and Spaces. Here's what we have so far:

• \$38,500 from the Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation

- \$9,000 from the Dexter Wellness Coalition/5 Healthy Towns Foundation
- \$22,500 from Webster Township

If we come up short, we may have to add paths to the individual buildings at a later date. We hope we won't have to do this, as it will be more expensive to bring the equipment back for these additions.

Construction is scheduled to begin on May 22, 2023, so the walking path will be completed in time for summer fundraising events. To see a site plan for the path, go to: <u>https://webstertownshiphistoricalsociety.org/bui</u>ldings-and-grounds.

The walking path will make the many fun events planned for this summer easier to access for everyone—a movie, "Tucker: A Man and His Dream," in the barn on June 4 in cooperation with the Northfield Township Area Library, a Flea Market on June 10, a Rockabilly Motorcycle Extravaganza in partnership with the Dexter Senior Center to present on July 15, and a Bluegrass Jamboree and Ice Cream Social on August 5 with the Dexter Senior Center scooping the ice cream. Several more events are planned for the fall along with, of course, the 40th Webster Fall Festival on September 23. See the calendar of events on Page 5.

the building entrances. Although we originally planned to have brick pathways between the path spurs and each building entrance, this proves to be a costly, time-consuming strategy. The Board voted to have only one more brick path leading to the Old Town Hall. PHOTOGRAPHY IN HISTORIC WEBSTER VILLAGE

In response to requests for permission to have senior/graduation/wedding/holiday photos taken in Historic Webster Village, we are developing rates and policies to allow professional photographers to use our grounds and

buildings. Why, you may ask, do we need to do this? Through conversations with other historical



societies, we learned that there are liabilities both for WTHS and the photographers that need to be addressed. Should anyone get hurt during a photo shoot or should damage be done to WTHS holdings, we need policies in place to deal with the situation. We'll keep you posted on our progress—it shouldn't take much longer.

HISTORY CORNER

The Establishment of Webster Corners. Early settlers of the Webster area were the Hon. Samuel W. Dexter (1824) and Charles B. Taylor (1824), purchasing land in the southwest corner of the township near the present-day city of Dexter. Thomas Alexander from Wales and Luther Boyden from Conway, MA, settled in Webster Township (1826) in an area called Boyden's Plain and were later that same year joined by Israel Arms from MA. Charles Starks arrived from PA and settled on the north side of Boyden's Plain in 1827. Salmon H. Matthews arrived here in 1827 from Conway, MA. Next came Peter Sears, who settled in the southeast corner of the township, and Sturms Kimberly, Ezra Fish, and Ira Seymour. In 1828, John Williams arrived from Sempronius, NY, with his wife and 10 children. Henry Scadin also arrived in 1828. In 1829, Munnis Kenny and family and Tillotson Wheeler settled in Webster

Township. Munnis Kenny suggested the township be named after the statesman Daniel Webster. Accounts of these people can be found in the several books written by James Baldwin Parker and many of their graves can be found in the Webster Church Cemetery. 
