We are planning more free programming and activities for this fall and will keep you informed as events, dates and times become available.


Walking Path. The "2-for 1 Walking Path Challenge" to match a \$10,000 donation netted \$5,510, thus making the challenge plus a bit

#### **BLUEGRASS JAMBOREE IS A SUCCESS!**

On Saturday, August 5, WTHS, in partnership with Companion Banjos and the Dexter Senior Center, hosted the first Bluegrass Jamboree and Ice Cream Social in Historic Webster Village. Stephanie and Chris Sorenson of Companion Banjos not only performed—The Companion Band—during the Jamboree, but also reserved the bands and played a major role in the event publicity. A huge shout out to them for their support!

The event was kicked off with a ribbon- cutting ceremony provided by the Dexter Chamber of Commerce officially opening our new ADA compliant walking path in the Village.



The Jamboree was a big hit with the community, drawing almost 300 guests—both adults and children—to the village. The Dieterle Corncrib stage hosted local entertainers, including the Companion Band, the Northwoods Ramblers, and Cedar Creek Bluegrass.

Attendees were welcome to tour the historic buildings, participate in open jam circles to fiddle, pick, and stomp their feet in the shade of lush maple and oak trees, play cornhole, blow bubbles, have their faces painted, drum to the beat of the music, and enjoy the beautiful sunny summer day.

#### WEBSTER FALL FESTIVAL

This event takes place annually on the fourth Saturday in September on the grounds of Historic Webster Village and the Webster United Church of Christ (WUCC) sanctuary. The 40<sup>th</sup> annual Webster Fall Festival is just around the corner! Everyone's favorite day of good, old-fashioned family fun will take place this year on Saturday, September 23 from 10:00am – 6:00pm.

There is something for everybody at this family-friendly community event: Hayrides, music, crafters, an auction, farm animals, children's activities, great food, displays of antique equipment, historical buildings with displays, baked goods and preserves for purchase, demonstrations including wool spinning and blacksmithing!

#### HISTORY CORNER

Webster Chronology 1833 – 1946

**1833:** Webster separated from Dexter and organized as a town by Territorial Council; named after Daniel Webster.

**1834:** First Post office established in Webster Township in the home of Moses Kingsley.

**1836:** Webster Church completed (with the help of a \$100 donation from Daniel Webster).

**1837:** Michigan became the 26<sup>th</sup> state in the Union on January 28.

**1838:** Podunk School was built on Merkel Road near Walsh Road.

**1846:** A new Podunk School was built on Walsh Road at the corner of Merkel Road after fire destroyed the original building.

**1863:** Webster Township Civil War bond drive held

**1871:** Attendance law adopted in Michigan requiring all children between 8 and 14 to attend school at least 3 months per year.

Webster Township Hall was built at the corner of Gregory and Scully Roads.

**1873:** Michigan school attendance law altered to require all children between 8 and 14 to attend school at least 4 months per year

**1892:** The Pledge of Allegiance to the flag was introduced into Michigan schools.

**1899:** A new steel bridge was built over the Huron River on the north side of Dexter.

1919: Michigan Legislature declared October 21 as Will Carleton Day [William McKendree Carleton (1845 – 1912) was an American poet from Michigan. Carleton's poems were most often about his rural life.]

**1946:** Podunk School was permanently closed.
