## RECIPE CORNER - DITA'S HOMEMADE RANCH DRESSING

Homemade Ranch Dressing
1/2 cup mayonnaise
1/2 cup sour cream
1/2 cup buttermilk
1 tsp dried or fresh dill
1/2 tsp dried or fresh parsley
1/2 tsp dried or fresh chives
1/4 tsp onion powder
1/2 tsp garlic powder
1/4 tsp fine sea salt
1/8 tsp finely cracked pepper
1 Tbsp dill pickle juice


# NEED A RIDE? RIDE THE WAVE!


